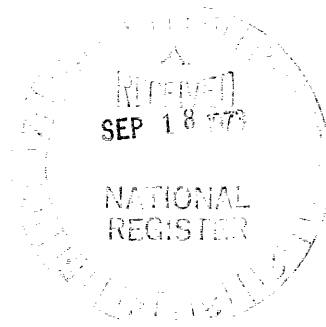
Exterior:

Two-story clapboard classic revival structure was built ca. 1871. It has a raised foundation and giant-order tetrastyle pedimented portico with balcony. Columns are attenuated Tuscan. Windows are 4/4 double sash. Similar to houses of the Adam/Federal period in general proportions, additional details include swan's-neck brackets at the eaves, baroque woodwork in over-window panels, and ornate pediment mouldings.

Interior:

The structure is square and consists of eight rooms: four downstairs, four upstairs. The stair rail is of walnut and the floors upstairs are original and of pine.

The present fabric is in excellent condition; the current owner, who acquired the property in 1961, has restored and maintained the structure in an appropriate manner. The grounds have been cleared and beautified, with special attention to existing old boxwoods.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Ingleside was built ca. 1871 by Dr. John Belton O'Neal Landrum, one of South Carolina's early Upcountry historians. A combination of satisfying proportions and carefully-detailed wood carvings make this a simple yet striking Upcountry residence.

Architecture:

A German craftsman was brought in to execute the unusual woodwork and remained at Ingleside for one year. The unique detail of the brackets and baroque woodwork, and the size and proportions of the building, distinguish the structure from the more typical South Carolina Upcountry house. Ingleside is an interesting example of eclectic architecture, chiefly reflecting the stick style, classic revival and Palladian (note the stance of the columns supporting the portico).

Literature:

Ingleside was the home of Dr. J. B. O. Landrum, one of Spartanburg County's earliest historians. He is known for two works: Colonial and Revolutionary History of Upper South Carolina, History of Spartanburg County.

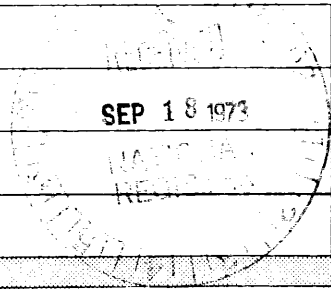
